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ACADEMICS

We are proud of the spirit of education that exists in the Wellington Exempted Village School District through excellent opportunities for children to become lifelong learners, including:

- PreK 12 education provided in a **collaborative and nurturing environment**
- A personalized education for every student, including a continuum of services for students with disabilities, those who have been identified as gifted, or have different learning styles
- The **SpringBoard** platform prepares students in grades 6-12 with the skills and knowledge that matter most for college and career readiness
- A low 16:1 student to teacher ratio, with 100% of core academic subjects and elementary classes taught by Highly Qualified Teachers
- Advanced Placement (AP) courses in World History, American History, American Government, Literature and Language; Pre-AP courses in English, Algebra, World History and Biology; and Honors courses in ELA, Math and Science
- **NWEA and MAPS** assessments monitor student progress throughout the year and year-to-year
- Partnerships with the Lorain County Joint
 Vocational School for career and technical education, the Pathways to Success program for alternative pathways to graduation, and the Lorain County Community College Wellington Center for higher education opportunities
- Career development in agriculture through **Future Farmers of America**
- College credit options, saving families thousands of dollars off college tuition
- Free, all-day Kindergarten

Every student learns differently, and technology allows educators to accommodate unique learning styles on a case-by-case basis.

Wellington Exempted Village schools leverage the power of technology to not only advance learning in our classrooms, but to engage our students using the very tools they enjoy in their home life. This includes:

- Using online educational programs that can be used at school as well as home, such as the Lexia reading program, Xtra Math, and Study Island, which integrates with our progress monitoring assessments so that teachers can see related growth patterns
- Enhanced learning opportunities with Chromebook laptops for students K-12, iPad carts, interactive SMART boards in classrooms, and modern computer labs in each school
- **Participation in special programs,** such as the national "Hour of Code" helping to nurture problem-solving skills, logic and creativity. By starting early, students will have a foundation for success in any 21st-century career path

Local grocer William Brumfeld came forward to rally the community to raise needed funds in the span of five months to build the Patricia Lindley Performing Arts Center at McCormick Arts Center. This center will be a reminder for years to come that even a small group of people can change their world if they work together, one brick at a time. Participation in performing and visual arts inspires students' creativity, problem-solving and critical thinking skills. Abundant creative programming helps to develop individual talents through the fine arts, theater, choir, band and orchestra:

- The annual district-wide Art Show features hundreds of entries showcasing a variety of art mediums
- Several Wellington students received honors at the Lorain County Regional Scholastic Art Exhibition
- Combined high school choirs received a III rating at the District Ohio Music Education Association (OMEA) Adjudicated event
- Each year, Wellington students earn 'Superior' and 'Excellent' ratings at the Lorain County Solo and Ensemble contest
- Wellington High School Concert Band received a 'Superior' rating at **OMEA District contest** and qualified for the **State Concert Band** competition
- Wellington High School Marching Band earned a 'Superior' performance at the **Brunswick Sound Spectacular**
- The Dukes took First Place and Best Auxiliary in Class C and qualified for the **State Marching Band Finals**
- Each year Wellington High School students are nominated to participate in the Cleveland Orchestra Honors Choir at Severance Hall
- Several students are selected annually to participate in the **Honors Performance Series at Carnegie Hall in New York City**

- Committed to having fun, being a part of a team and working hard year round







GRANTS AND SCHOLARSHIPS



The Wellington Schools actively seek out grants, scholarships and awards to supplement programming provided through federal, state, and local support. Some of these funding initiatives include:

- This past year, WEVSD received two, 2-year 21st Century Community Learning Center grants totaling \$2 million to support Boys and Girls Club after-school programming at Westwood and McCormick, and college & career programming that includes ACT & SAT prep and tutoring at Wellington High School.
- A total of \$9,463 was raised across the school district during the annual Wellington Kiwanis Peterson Nut Sale. Proceeds from the sale benefit a scholarship fund for high school seniors.
- The annual **Duke Pride Carnival** raises money to support our summer Well-help food vouchers for families in need.

Did You Know?

WEVSD held its first-ever **Kindergarten College Night** in partnership with Kiwanis Club of Wellington for families to receive information on opening a **College Advantage Account** to begin saving for college. Through this program \$50 was donated to each family in attendance to make their first deposit in the account. The Wellington Schools Endowment also provided a 25% matching gift.

The event was made possible thanks to the generous donations from our sponsors, including: **The Kiwanis Club of Wellington, Lorain County Community College, Fifth Third Bank, Wellington Schools Endowment, Mercy Health, Farmers Savings Bank and LorMet Credit Union.**

COMMUNITY SERVICE



Community service is a hallmark of our dedication to developing wellrounded students. As such, high schoolers have a 60-hour community service requirement to graduate, leaving a lasting mark on our students and community as a whole.

The Wellington community and local businesses have a long tradition of supporting our schools and we are grateful for the support. Some community service activities include:

- In partnership with the Wellington Kiwanis Club, students can participate in K-Kids, Builder's or Key Club service organizations.
- Wellington High School students take an active part in community volunteering through a Community Service Day.
- Our schools were honored to receive \$640,000 last year alone from our generous community to support student programs and facility improvements.

Did You Know?

Wellington High School student Jenna Calfo qualified to receive the President's Volunteer Service Award for having more than 275 community service hours in her high school career.

SAFE SPACES TO LEARN & GROW

Wellington Exempted Village Schools believe in providing school-wide systems of support that include strategies for defining, teaching, and supporting appropriate student behaviors to create positive school environments.

A continuum of positive behavior supports for all students is implemented in areas including the classroom and non-classroom settings (such as hallways, buses, and restrooms). Abundant student-led activities helps these positive cultures to flourish, including:

- High school clubs include National Honor Society, Friends of Rachel's and Rachel's Challenge, Student Council, Future Farmers of America, Anime Club, Civil War History Club, SADD, and Drama Club
- Positive Behavior Intervention Supports implementation in all schools
- Dynamic Duke award for students K-8
- Student of the Month character recognition K-12
- **OLWEUS** Bullying Prevention Program in all schools
- McCormick Middle School honors **local** veterans each year
- **D.A.R.E. Officer** (Drug Abuse Resistance Education program) presence in all schools to support students and reinforce making good decisions
